

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar National Law University (earlier known as National Law University Haryana), Rai, Sonepat (hereinafter abbreviated as DBRANLU) was established by the State Government of Haryana in the year 2012 vide State Legislature Act No. 15 of 2012. DBRANLU is the first fully residential National Law University in Haryana.

As a tribute to Bharat Ratna Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, a great visionary, social reformer and architect of our present legal system and craftsman of our Constitution, the State Legislature of Haryana through an amendment in 2014, changed the name of the University to Dr. B.R. Ambedkar National Law University, Rai, Sonepat. A *state-of-the-art* campus has been constructed in the education hub of India –Rajiv Gandhi Education City, Rai, Sonepat falling under National Capital Region – where more than thirteen renowned educational Institutions/ Universities are located. The University provides a positive and congenial environment for legal education and professional training besides the overall development of students. It is well connected by Air, Rail and Road to all major points of State and the Nation with a distance of approx. 30 KMs from National Capital Delhi, and approx. 215 KMs. from State Capital Chandigarh. The University has been approved by the Bar Council of India (BCI) since 2019. It got registered with the University Grants Commission (UGC), New Delhi under Section 2(f) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956.

Presently DBRANLU offers the following Course:

B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) Five-Year Integrated Course

This Programme is interdisciplinary and follows the Semester System wherein Social Sciences subjects like Economics, English, Hindi, Sanskrit, History, Political Science and Sociology are taught along with Law subjects in the first two years of study. From the third year onwards, the curriculum comprises all Law subjects. The successful students are awarded B.A.LL.B. (Honours) Degree with specialization.

The teaching methodology is holistic which includes extensive and intensive classroom teaching with an emphasis on participative practical learning. The Courses include assignments, symposiums, seminars, field visits and project works.

The course is designed to keep in view the balanced requirements of society as well as Industry with pragmatic professionalism and research-based teaching-learning inputs.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

The Admission is based on the merit through the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT). However, to qualify for admission:-

 The candidate must have passed 10+2 examination of the Board of School Education, Haryana or its equivalent State/Central Board with minimum 45% marks in the aggregate (40% marks for SC/ST candidates)

OR

The candidate must have passed 10th with two year diploma course or one year diploma course with one year apprenticeship from the ITIs recognized by the Skill Development & Industrial Training Institutes Department, Haryana, with Hindi or English as an additional subject from the Haryana Board of School Education, Bhiwani.

- 2. The candidates appearing in or awaiting results of the qualifying examination held or being held in March/April 2023 may also apply and appear for the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) provisionally, subject to the condition that they shall produce the proof of having passed the qualifying examination with the prescribed percentage of marks and other requisite documents at the time of their counselling for admission at DBRANLU, Sonepat.
- 3. The candidature of:
 - a) those who do not clear the qualifying examination with the requisite marks **and or** fail to produce the result on the date of counselling, or
 - b) Those who get compartments/re-appear in any subject in the qualifying examination shall be cancelled and subsequent securing qualifying marks shall not be considered in any case.

A candidate applying in any type of reserved category is required to submit a category certificate issued by the competent authority on the date and time of Counselling.

INTAKE & RESERVATION

The total sanctioned intake for the B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) Five-Year Integrated Course excluding Supernumerary seats shall be One Hundred and Twenty (120).

WL: Wards of Landowners whose land has been acquired under the Land Acquisition Policy of the Government for Rajiv Gandhi Education City, Sonepat.

- 1. Candidate applying in any type of reserved category is required to submit category certificate issued by the competent authority.
- 2. The candidate applying under WL category shall have to produce a certificate mentioning that his/her or his/her ancestral land has been acquired under the land acquisition policy of Rajiv Gandhi Education City, Rai, Sonepat. The said certificate should be duly verified by the concerned Tehsildar.

- 3. The allocation of the candidates to DBRNLU, Sonepat by the CLAT Authority through the Centralised Admission process shall be provisional subject to verification of original certificates/ testimonials and documents by DBRANLU. Therefore, candidates are required to submit the admission form available in the DRBANLU Prospectus alongwith the attested copies of the documents/certificates.
- 4. The Candidates are required to produce original Certificates / Documents on the date of the interview/ counselling. Failure to produce Certificates/Documents in original shall result in cancellation of their candidature.
- 5. Conversion of reserved seats into the general category: In case of non-availability of the candidate in the reserved category, the vacant seat(s) shall be converted as under: (i) On non-availability of a ST candidate, the seat shall be converted into the SC Category, (ii) On non-availability of SC candidate, the seat shall be converted into General Category, (iii) On non-availability of DSC candidate, the seat shall be converted into SC Category, (iv) On non-availability of an EWS Category candidate, the seat shall be converted into the General Category, (v) On non-availability of WL category candidate, the seat shall be converted into the General Category, (v) On non-availability of WL category candidate, the seat shall be converted into the UR-HR Category, (vi) In the event of the quota reserved for PWD remain unutilized due to non-availability for the suitable category of handicapped candidates, it shall be offered to the Ex-servicemen and their wards and the dependents of Freedom Fighters as per Haryana Govt. Reservation Policy.

HOSTELS

Dr. B. R. Ambedkar National Law University started its first academic session in July 2019. Four batches of B.A. LL.B.(Hons.) have been admitted and the University is functioning from its main campus i.e. Plot No. 5, Rajiv Gandhi Education City, Rai, Sonepat, Haryana.

Boys and Girls Hostels are under the overall supervision of the Chief Warden. He/She is assisted by the team of Wardens and Hostel Supervisors. All admitted students have to reside in University Hostels.

Hostels are constructed on the latest modern pattern. These are equipped with all facilities and equipped with neat & clean mess/dining facilities. Hostels have 8 floors which are approachable through lift and stairs. The needs of Specially Abled Persons are also kept in consideration and hostels are comfortable and accomodable for them. Hostels are also equipped with Water Purifier systems attached with water coolers to ensure pure drinkable water supply, 24 hours power backup. Proper hygiene and sanitation are maintained by the housekeeping service. The hostels have round-the-clock security cover and all the hostels are equipped with Wi-fi connection. The hostel rooms are furnished with bed(s), study table(s), and study chair(s). Every room has been provided with wardrobe(s) having sufficient storage capacity. Hostels have rooms for both single accommodation and double-accommodation. The rooms are allotted as per the policy of DBRANLU. There are recreational facilities for the hostels like Table-Tennis Boards, Televisions, Carrom Boards etc.

LIBRARY

In any educational institution, a proper place with a suitable ambiance and environment for study with concentration and availability of sufficient resource bank of study material, that is books and modern source of ICT are basic necessity. Our university provides a well-designed spacious separate library premise with air-conditioned reading halls having adequate seating capacity. The library is equipped with modern stacks of a varied and rich collection of textbooks, journals, reference books and periodicals along with e-resources. The library also provides access to many useful legal online databases for the use of students, research scholars and faculty members as well.

UNIVERSITY GUEST HOUSE

The guest house is a double-storey building. There are 8 suites, VIP Lounge, Waiting Area, and a spacious dining hall with a kitchen. The best services and care is provided to the guests/parents during their stay at the guest house.
